Option 1: Sandy Ho—Making Online Learning Manageable and Interactive

Description: "Can you hear me?" "Turn on your mic," "Teacher, I cannot find it. Help!" Sound familiar? Covid-19 has changed so much. ESL programs have migrated to virtual platforms, but you are finding it requires more than just finding resources and setting a computer up. We will discuss these frustrations and explore ways to adapt, live with, mitigate or lessen them while keeping interactions meaningful. You will get some tips on how to keep track of tasks, activities,

assessments, messages and accounts, and how to help students feel connected while "disconnected."

Bio: Sandy Ho has been an Adult ESL instructor with the YCDSB for over 6 years. She has a Masters in Applied Linguistics and Exegesis, a TESL Canada Level 3 Professional Certificate, a TESL Ontario Certificate, and is PBLA (Portfolio-based language assessments) trained. Prior to working with new immigrants, she was Academic Director and Curriculum Developer for a chain of private language schools across North America, overseeing 10 private language schools. Sandy has worked as IELTS Assessor, Spanish, and Linguistics instructor, and tutored academic English privately. She uses technology quite extensively in her teaching and develops a lot of resources online.



Option 2: Gail Tiessen—Effective Bible-Based ESL Materials

Description: In this workshop, Gail will use the parable of *The Prodigal Son* to demonstrate how to effectively develop ESL learners' proficiency in listening and speaking.

Option 1: Sara Dasko—Lesson Planning: Pronunciation: Tips and Resources Description: Keeping it Together: 4 Lesson Plan Types for Pronunciation Keeping it Real: 3 Common Problems and Solutions for Pronunciation Keeping it Natural: 3 Adaptable Activities, 2 Online Resources, 2 Textbooks

Bio: Sara Dasko is a certified Project Management Professional (PMP), Project Management Consultant, Trainer and Instructor, and Free Mind Coach. She holds a BA in General Studies with a Double Minor in Philosophy and Behavioral Studies. Additionally, she has certificates in Teamwork and Team building, Leadership and Influence, Coaching and Mentoring, Personal Success, as well as a Toast Masters' Advisor certificate, and a linguistic certification (TIU) from Wycliffe.

Sara is also an entrepreneur and has run her own company since 2010. She is a remarkable woman with a wide range of experience and talent advocating that education equals freedom. Dasko has been instructing since 2004. Her experience spans four continents and ages 2-75. She has taught government programs, non-profit and students of all levels. Using her love for writing, she was the founder and editor of two newspapers: CCHS and Ambrose University.

She has written several books, including a novel, a children's book and teaching manuals. As well, she has developed many training programs over the years.

Option 2: Sandi Howell—Conversation Circles: An Easy and Fun Outreach Tool

Description: Conversation circles provide an effective and enjoyable way to help learners improve confidence and proficiency in the English language. They are intended for those who know how to read and write English but who are reluctant to speak it. Conversation circles offer dynamic, minimally structured conversations between learners on a variety of topics, although it is important for facilitators to plan and prepare for each session.

This workshop will present three aspects of conversation circles:

- 1. Preparing material according to various learning styles, level of English previously attained, interests & needs.
- 2. Learning how to engage students in a conversation using various strategies.
- 3. Choosing topics that might open conversation further to spiritual and/or relational matters.

Bio: Sandi and her husband, Don, have been active missionaries for 30 years, with Overseas Missionary Fellowship (OMF) International. Sandi is the Coordinator for Connections East Asia (CEA), a part of OMF that uses English as a Second Language (ESL) as an outreach to East Asians. Sandi uses CEA's resources and training to help Canadian churches in their outreach to newcomers.

Sandi has 20 years of Conversational English ministry in Singapore, Edmonton and the Greater Toronto Area. For the past 15 years she was the lead tutor for the Conversational English classes at Trinity Streetsville and for the past 4 years she was the lead for the Newcomers ESL Hub at The Peoples Church. She is a professional member of TESL Ontario. In all her experience she has learned to be creative and flexible in supporting her teaching teams and newcomers' needs. Sandi and her husband have recently moved to the BC Interior where Sandi continues to teach and train via Zoom.



Option 3: Janice Penner—On the Road ... A Journey Through the Bible for Migrants

Description: "It's hard to leave your homeland and the people you love, and venture into the unknown."

The United Bible Societies produced *On the Road...a Journey Through the Bible for Migrants* with 33 migration stories from the Bible as well as stories from contemporary migrants who share their story of changed lives. Although this 2008 resource is excellent, the language isn't accessible to language learners. Janice will present activities and materials she has developed to support faith-based language learners

and volunteer teachers. This affordable publication is also available in Spanish, Farsi, French, Chinese and Arabic. <u>Bibles Canada</u>, a resource of the Canadian Bible Society, offers the book on their website.

Bio: Janice has been teaching English since 1984. She began her career in a faith-based program in Japan in 1979. She returned to Japan for 2 years much later and has taught in the PRC, ROC and Kazakhstan. Her academic home is Douglas College. She started a network for Metro Vancouver programs in 2006 but has not facilitated it consistently. Her desire is to re-activate the local ministry and support a Canada-wide initiative for faith-based programs.
