# **Good Friday and Easter Sunday in History**

- Good Friday and Easter Sunday are holidays for Christians in many countries. These days are similar to the days in the Jewish Passover celebration. On these days, many Christians remember two things that happened in the land of Israel about 2000 years ago. At that time, the Jewish people were part of the Roman Empire, and the Jewish leaders cooperated with the Roman authorities.
- A man named Jesus had been telling Israel that God's kingdom was near. Jesus said he could forgive sin, free people from slavery to sin, and give people a place in God's family. Those closest to him believed that he was God's promised king. Jesus did many miracles to show that God had sent him, such as giving sight to the blind. He did not teach his followers to become rebels. He taught that God had sent him to die for his people; through his death many would find life. He said the government would kill him, but after three days he would rise from death. So God would show that Jesus was the promised king, with power over sin and death.
- Jesus was popular and the Jewish leaders were jealous. And they hated him because he would not fully obey them. Jesus kept showing them that he was fully obeying God, but they were not. This made them very angry. Finally, the Jewish leaders and the Roman authority agreed to put Jesus to death on a cross. This happened on a Friday. Friday passed, Saturday passed, and Sunday came. Even though Roman soldiers were guarding the burial place, Jesus rose. The day of Jesus' death is now called Good Friday, and the day of his rising from death is called Easter Sunday.
- At first Jesus' followers were afraid; they did not believe Jesus was alive. But Jesus came to them again and again. He talked with them about what the prophets had written: God's promised king must die and rise again. Jesus told them that the Holy Spirit would come to them. The Spirit would help them tell the world about Jesus. Then Jesus was taken into heaven. When the Holy Spirit came, the disciples became very confident. They told everyone that Jesus was the great king. They said that Jesus would judge all the world. They also said that Jesus offered sinners forgiveness and new life in the Spirit if only they would receive it. Some people believed, but others became angry. The unbelievers did not want new life; they did not want to leave their life of sin. Sometimes the unbelievers attacked the believers, but the believers did not stop believing.

## SOME EXPRESSIONS RELATED TO CRUCIFIXION

- **carry your cross** when someone is going through a difficult experience or has a prolonged physical problem people may refer to it as a cross to bear "She has a lot of health problems. It is her cross to carry."
- **to crucify someone** means to brutally attack and destroy a person's reputation or character "Those news reporters really crucified the mayor."
- **excruciating (pain)** means extreme pain like the pain that one who has been crucified would suffer "My tooth really hurts. I can't sleep, and I can't eat. It is excruciating."

# From the prophet Isaiah who lived 700 years before Jesus was born (Isaiah 53:7-12)

He was beaten down and punished.
But he didn't say a word.

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus. God called me to be an apostle and chose me to tell the Good News. God promised this Good News long ago through his prophets. That promise is written in the Holy Scriptures. The Good News is about God's Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. As a man, he was born from the family of David. But through the Spirit of holiness he was declared to be God's Son with great power by rising from death.
